PLAYER INFORMATION

The Omanu & Mount Maunganui Golf Clubs WELCOME all players and supporters to the 33rd Kaimai Classic.

START TIMES:

Saturday - Omanu 10.00am Mount Maunganui 10.30am Sunday - Omanu 9.00 am Mount Maunganui 9.30am.

START TEES:

Ladies-Yellow teesSilver/Bronze.SaturdayOmanu / Sunday MountMen-White TeesJunior Division.SaturdayOmanu / Sunday MountMen-Blue TeesSenior & IntermediateSaturdayMount / Sunday Omanu

MARKERS: Mount. To FRONT of the Green White 135m. Red 100m.
Omanu. To MIDDLE of the Green White 135m. Red 100m

TOURNAMENT & COMPETITION:

The **Tournament** is played over 36 holes Strokeplay - in all divisions.

The **Competition** is: 36 Holes Stableford - in each division

There is a Gross winner and runner-up in both the men's and women's fields.

Divisions. Senior Men +5 to 9.8 Intermediate Men 9.9 to 15.7 Junior Men 15.8 to 33.5.

Women Silver +1 to 17.8 Bronze 17.9 to 40.4.

NOTE: Divisions will be as determined by the Host Club "Omanu" and maybe subject to change

TWO'S: Available from the Pro Shop of each club..

SCORE CARDS:

Score Cards will be handed to you on your starting tee for each round.

<u>Please return your completed & signed score card to the Officials in the Clubhouse.</u>

Incomplete or incorrect cards will disqualify the player from the competition.

PLACING: - 15cm placing on own Mown Fairway

PACE OF PLAY: "Players Responsibility".

Course Marshalls will be monitoring the "Pace of Play" to ensure that the field moves quickly.

Penalty for Breach of "Pace of Play" the playing four will receive a verbal warning and each subsequent warning will incur a 1 and then a 2 stroke penalty and be disqualified for a 4^{th} incident.

TIES.

Where there is more than one winning total the winner will be determined by (DOT Golf) countback.

ARTIFICIAL MEASURING DEVICES:

A player may use a measuring device designed to measure or gauge distance only.

Use of any device that does not comply with this requirement will disqualify the player from the tournament.

SUSPENSION OF PLAY:

Play temporarily suspended - 3 consecutive 10 second blasts of the siren.

May only finish the hole being played.

Dangerous Situation - 1 continuous 30 second blast of the siren.

Mark the ball position & return to clubhouse.

Resume Play - 1 Prolonged blast of the siren.

In the event of a cancellation of a round or part thereof, the Match Committee shall determine "the Competition" for that round and the ruling may apply to one or both courses.

MATCH COMMITTEE:

The decisions of the Match Committee for each course shall be final in all matters.

LOCAL RULES:

Refer to the score card of each club and Local Rules Notice Board otherwise the Rules of Golf apply.

Note: To avoid unnecessary delays

Rule 3.3 enables a player to play a second ball if in doubt as to any procedure or ruling. (A definitive ruling is to be obtained from the Committee on the completion of the round).

Washouts in Bunkers - where caused by water run-off resulting from rain or irrigation to be treated as G.U.R.

(Ball to be dropped in the bunker).

MT MAUNGANUI LOCAL RULES INFORMATION

(Please read carefully)

= 15CM PLACING ON OWN MOWN FAIRWAYS

START TIME:

ALL PLAYERS ARE REQUIRED TO BE AT THEIR STARTING TEE AND TO REPORT TO THE STARTER AT THE TEE TEN (10) MINUTES PRIOR TO THEIR OFFICIAL STARTING TIME.

NOTE: START TIMES WILL BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO;

Any late arrival on the starting tee will, irrespective of the reason for lateness incur automatic disqualification

from that round of the tournament.

OUT OF BOUNDS:

All perimeter fences, and / or white stakes defining the boundary of the course, car parks, the clubhouse and paved surrounds. Note: Practice Chipping area (left of the 6th Green) is GUR. Drop Zone must be Used

ABNORMAL GROUND CONDITIONS/GROUND UNDER REPAIR (Rule 25)

(Marked with a continuous White line and / or Blue pegs with GUR

(A) Newly laid turf surrounding sprinkler heads.

- (D) Green-keepers work area and depot. (12th & 17th)
- (B) Areas bounded by white lines and or Blue Pegs. (C) Ornamental Gardens (except Grant Clements

Memorial Garden on the 18th)

ROADS AND PATHS:

All artificially surfaced roads and paths and unformed paths are immovable obstructions (Rule 24-2)

NOTE - any timber edging to roads and paths are immovable obstructions.

FIXED SPRINKLER HEADS:

Drainage grates and fairway distance markers, all fixed sprinkler heads, drainage grates and fairway distance markers are immovable obstructions.

NOTE - any timber edging to roads and paths are immovable obstructions.

STAKED TREES:

Relief for interference by them is available under Rule 24-2 (does not includes the trees with large stakes on the 6th Hole that are not staked trees)

EMBEDDED BALL:

On a closely mown area through the green a ball embedded in its own pitch mark in ground other than in sand may be lifted, cleaned and replaced, without penalty as near as possible to the spot where it lay but not nearer the hole.

TEE Sign & MARKERS:

All tee markers on tee blocks are a movable obstruction. All Tee signs and protection fences (2nd -3rd -6th-12th tees) are immovable obstructions and Rule 24-2 will apply. There is no relief for intervention.

Rakes should be left inside the bunkers, in the centre (base of bunker) not the edges.

BUNKERS;

Enter the bunker at the lowest point.

Ensure that bunkers are raked after use.

Smooth the slopes with the reverse (smooth) side of the rake.

TRUNDLERS AND CARTS;

Trundlers & Carts are NOT to be taken close to tees or greens or between bunkers and greens.

Carts are not to be parked within 5m of the greens or tee blocks.

ARTIFICIAL DEVICES:

During the tournament a player may use a MEASURING DEVICE designed to MEASURE OR GAUGE DISTANCE ONLY.

A player or group who is timed will have a "bad time" carried forward in the round even if the group subsequently arrives back in position or within time.

SUSPENSION OF PLAY:

Normal situation 3 consecutive 10 second blast on the siren (repeated) Dangerous situation 1 continuous 30 second blast on the siren (repeated) Resumption of play 1 prolonged blast on the siren (repeated)

- (A) If play is suspended due to heavy rain or flooding players may finish the hole they are playing if they so choose. They should not play another hole.
 - If they choose not to complete the hole in play they should carefully mark the position of their ball.
- (B) If there is suspension of play due to a dangerous situation (e.g. lightning) All players must discontinue play immediately

Players should carefully mark the position of their ball.

All players should return to the club house and await an announcement.

HAZARD WARNING:

CAUTION:

Players are warned to take special care when approaching the 5th & 14th Greens.

Players using the 6th & 12th tees will be hitting their drives close to the respective greens.

Care to be exercised to the right of the 5th green and the left of the 14th green.

Those hitting off the 6th and 12th tees are to pay special attention to players on the 5th and 14th holes.

Course Playing Time Schedule:

Please note you're playing group should complete each set of 6 holes as follows:

These playing times are provided for you to monitor the Pace of Play of your group.

SLOW PLAY WILL BE MONITORED - KEEP UP WITH THE PLAYING GROUP IN FRONT

PACE OF PLAY:

The time for completion of a round is 4 hours.

The pace of play will be monitored.

If the first group is in excess of the elapsed time allowed for the completion of the hole in play, or in the case of the second or subsequent group, is more than the starting interval behind the group ahead, "then they are out of position".

OMANU LOCAL RULES INFORMATION

(Please read carefully)

15CM PLACING ON OWN MOWN FARIWAY

1. GROUND UNDER REPAIR; -

All areas under repair defined by white lines.

Greenkeepers' rubbish pile & firewood between 8th, 9th and 10th fairways.

Relief may be taken in accordance with rule 25 (G.U.R)

Fresh mulch under unstaked trees is to be treated as GUR

1. GROUND UNDER REPAIR. PLAY PROHIBITED.

- (a) All cultivated gardens, newly grassed areas and all roped off areas. Relief MUST be taken under rule 25.
- (b) Fenced areas between 1st Tee & 9th Green / Fairway
- (c) Machinery tracks running between 1st and 9th Fairway

2. PROTECTION OF YOUNG TREES (Identified by stakes)

If such a tree interferes with player's stance or swing, the ball <u>MUST</u> be lifted, without penalty, and dropped in accordance with rule 24-2*b* (Immovable obstruction)

3. OUT OF BOUNDS. Is defined by: -

- (a) White marker pegs and/or oil lines on right hand side of 15th, 17th and 18th fairways and behind 18th green.
- (b) Southern kerb of pathway from 1st to 10th tees.
- (c) White paint marks on exterior poles of driving range.
- (d) The clubhouse, the greenkeepers' sheds, the cart and motorcycle storage sheds and all paved areas surrounding these buildings including the car parking area and the paved area adjacent to the 1st tee.
- (e) The perimeter fencing surrounding the rest of the course.
- (f) 13th Hole temporary fencing is out of bounds

4. BALL EMBEDDED IN ITS OWN PITCH MARK....

Through the green, may be lifted, without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as possible to where it lay, but not nearer the hole. This relief is not available to a ball embedded in sand.

5. BALL STRIKING LANDING LIGHTS

or associated fences or coming to rest within the fenced area.

Cancel stroke. Compulsory replay. No penalty.

6. WATER HAZARDS are marked with pegs.

Lateral water hazards -- Red pegs. Water hazards -- Yellow pegs.

DROPPING ZONE -3^{RD} HOLE. If a ball is in or it is known or virtually certain that a ball has not been found, is in the water hazard (between the blue pegs), the player may:

- (i) Proceed under Rule 26: or as an additional option, drop a ball, under penalty of one stroke, in the nearest marked dropping zone (Rules of Golf page 122)
- (ii) Dropping zone applies only when playing the 3rd hole

7. SLOW PLAY

A warning will be issued by the Course Marshall or Referee of the day.

DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES. For all play on course, a player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures DISTANCE only. However, if, <u>during a stipulated round</u>, a <u>player carries a distance measuring device that has the ability to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his/her play (e.g., gradient, wind-speed, temperature, etc.), the player is in breach of Rule 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional functions are actually used.</u>

GENERAL PENALTY FOR BREACH OF ANY LOCAL RULE: - Stroke Play-two strokes
